Ideas from last week's Adult Bible study about beginning a family devotional this Sunday evening:

- 1. Set a time and prioritize evening routines. Announce reminders about the intent of having a special time for the family.
- 2. Begin the devotional "family time" by purposely having a *"too short" allotted* time. It is better to build up endurance than to create resentment. Maybe begin with a 5 minute dedicated time from start to finish.
- 3. Begin each devotional with a short, precise prayer.

For example: "Heavenly Father, thank you for our family. Thank you for our home. Bless our "family time" tonight. Help us to be like you in everything that we say and do. In Jesus Christ, Amen."

- 4. Set the prayer example, and then rotate the responsibility from the eldest to the youngest.
- 5. Know the lesson well. When an individual misses the point God is making in scripture there is a *double jeopardy*. *example: A person thinks 2 + 2 = 5 jeopardy #1= The person does not know the total of 2 + 2. jeopardy #2= The person does not know what makes up "5".*
