
Wednesday night class is alive and well.

Wissam is coming to Alpine 8/5/2020

"When I moved here six years ago, things were different. There was a supply of immigrants and refugees who continuously needed to learn English, and that provided the local ministries with open doors. We no longer have that supply, the children have learned English in schools and the adults have managed to go by without it, Angel House is closed and the building has been sold (I started teaching ESL at the local Lutheran Social Services' location instead.)....The new year started with the area's first Arab Christian meeting. Although it was done upon my suggestion, it wasn't at my place. Detroit has unfolded two Middle-Eastern couples plus one Iraqi doctor who are Christians as well (not from a Muslim background,) in addition to a recent Tunisian convert. We decided to meet every other Friday for singing and Bible study: an Arabic island in an English ocean.

A Chattanooga sister took the time to share her encounter with her Muslim coworker. In a longer email, she said "I met a man at work a couple of months ago and I found out about two weeks ago that he was Muslim. He is a custodian (cleaning person) at my company and I speak to him whenever I see him. He is an older, African American. Recently I asked him where he went to church, and he told me he as Muslim. I immediately knew that I wanted to give him your book." A Katy brother shared a similar story about an Arab store owner who is a friend of his. A Mt. Morris nurse met a Yemeni Muslim woman and they developed a close friendship. The Arab woman is divorced and she lives with her children an hour to the north of me. Her Christian friend, who had shared the gospel with her, managed to convince her congregation's eldership to invite me to share Islam in Christ's Eyes to expand the local outreach efforts.
