INDIAN LODGE TRAIL, Davis Mountains State Park

A fun hike that is just outside of Fort Davis, the Indian Lodge Trail in Davis Mountains State Park, is about 2 and half miles in length. The rocky, steep in sections, yet still moderate trail offers uninterrupted vistas of the surrounding high desert ranch land, including views of the McDonald Observatory to the north, and Blue Mountain and Mount Livermore to the west – the latter being the highest point in the Davis Mountains. Be sure to wear proper footwear and clothing for the desert, and bring plenty of water, as the trail is mostly unprotected from the sun. Follow the Park Road to the trail's namesake Indian Lodge to the parking lot behind the hotel. Here, you will find the trailhead. It's best to treat the Indian Lodge Trail as an "out and back", as the trail does not loop back to the parking lot. The Indian Lodge Trail at Davis Mountains State Park is about 30 miles away from the Alpine Church of Christ building, and is an easy day trip from Alpine and Marfa. JW
