

Growing in the grace and knowledge of our Lord on Wednesday nights

Are you "in" or "out" of the habit of meeting with fellow Christians on Wednesday nights? If "in", then you met five new fellow believers that have begun meeting with us on Wednesday nights. Every journey begins the same way, a first step.

New Wednesday night study! The People are the Temple.

The New Testament writers continue to use temple language, but they are no longer concerned with a building. Incredibly, when they write about the temple, they talk about the people of God! The apostle Paul writes, "do you not know that your body is a Temple of the Holy Spirit within you" (I Cor. 6:9-12).

At face value, this could be mistaken as an individualistic idea. However, in English we don't have a grammatically correct way to differentiate between a singular "you" and a plural "you all." Suffice it to say, all of the 'yous' in this text are actually second person plurals. That means we should read Paul's words as, "y'all's body is a temple of the Holy Spirit." There are some immense implications here, both for the early church and us today. The Bible Project
