



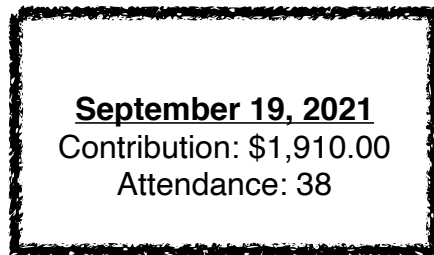

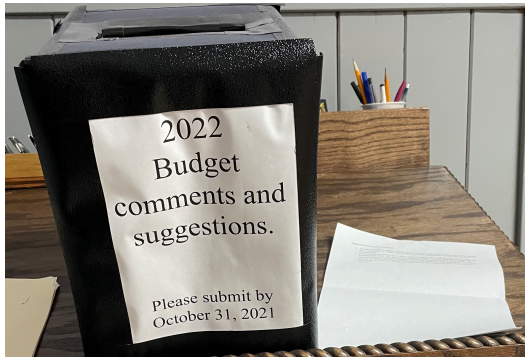

McDonald Observatory

Located atop Mount Locke in Jeff Davis County, the University of Texas' McDonald Observatory is a place that attracts visitors from all around the world. The Observatory is home to the 82" Otto Struve Telescope, which at one point was the largest of its kind. The elevation of the Observatory combined with the inky black night skies that far west Texas has to offer makes for some exceptional stargazing opportunities. Visitors to the area who will be staying in Alpine, Marfa, or Fort Davis can take advantage of this educational resource with daytime admission passes, guided tours, and nightly star parties. If you're not looking to stay the night but want uninterrupted high desert vistas, you can drive the Scenic Loop Road to the top of Mount Locke and take in the views. Located in the Frank N. Bash Visitor Center is the StarDate Café, which offers snacks and small meals to tide you over until your tour starts, or you head down the mountain. The McDonald Observatory is about 15 miles northwest of Fort Davis off of TX HWY 118, and is about a 45 minute drive from the Alpine Church of Christ building. Reservations for programs may be made at mcdonaldobservatory.org.
