Davis Mountains Preserve

Like a little slice of New Mexico or Colorado plopped down into west Texas, the Davis Mountains Preserve offers thousands of acres of protected land in the Davis Mountains. The contrast between the arid lowlands of the surrounding Trans-Pecos area and the forested Davis Mountains are sure to solidify that west Texas is a place of beauty to be appreciated. One of three sky islands in Texas, elevations in the preserve can rise upwards of 8,300 feet. The Davis Mountains Preserve is home to the highest point in the Davis Mountains, Baldy Peak on Mount Livermore (8,378 ft). Planning a trip to the Davis Mountains Preserve will take some coordination, as it is not open year-round. It is recommended that interested visitors check out the D.M.P.'s website to see when "Open Days" are scheduled. The Preserve is home to a wide variety of flora and fauna including Ponderosa Pine, Texas Madrone, Mexican Oaks, black bears, elk, mountain lions, and a whole lot more, all in the pristine and rugged habitat of the Davis Mountains.
