

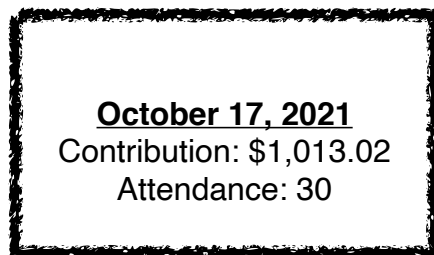

Madera Canyon Trail

An easy to moderate loop trail located in the Davis Mountains, the Madera Canyon Trail is about two and a half miles long and takes hikers up to an elevation of 6,050 feet. Located on HWY 118 about ten miles north of the McDonald Observatory, the Madera Canyon Trail is a hidden gem in the Davis Mountains. The trail is fairly travelled and maintained regularly, with clearly defined and somewhat wide paths to follow through its creek crossings and meandering route. Slight drop offs occur toward the beginning, and loose or large rocks can be found on the trail, so be sure to watch your step. The parking area is home to shaded picnic spots, which makes for a great place to rest and have a snack after hiking. If you're from a lower elevation, keep in mind that you will be hiking at around 6,000 feet, so be sure to take plenty of breaks and bring enough water, as there are no spigots on the trail and mobile phone service is limited. Bring your camera and hike the Madera Canyon Trail any day from sun-up to sundown. The Trail is located on HWY 118, about 35 minutes away from Fort Davis, and about 48 miles away from the Alpine Church of Christ building. -Joe Ed
