Peggy Lee Locke, 83, passed from this world into her Savior's arms on Oct. 18, 2020, surrounded by her family through love and prayer. She was born deep in the southwest Texas wilderness on a ranch in Grapevine Hills on Nov. 29, 1936, to Sheldon and Mae Finney. Peggy married Kenny Locke on Sept. 26, 1956, and they resided in Alpine, Texas, for decades. Kenny preceded Peggy in death on April 7, 2007, as did their son Gene on Nov. 15, 1962, and they are now reunited in a heavenly home. Peggy lived simply, and that shaped her perspective of what is truly important, often foregoing luxuries in order to make sure that her children were well provided for. She worked as a talented cook and dedicated in-home caregiver.
